♥ ADMISSION

College of Nursing GIMS Greater Noida is a Government Institution and admissions are done through **Atal Bihari Vajpayee Medical University, Lucknow through CNET Examination.**

♥ ADMISSION GUIDELINES BSC NURSING

- The minimum age for admission shall be 17 years on 31st December of the year in which admission is sought. The maximum age limit for admission shall be 35 years.
- Minimum Educational Qualification
 - ✎ Candidate with Science who has passed the qualifying 12th Standard examination (10+2) and must have obtained a minimum of 45% marks in Physics, Chemistry and Biology taken together and passed in English individually.
 - ✎ Candidates are also eligible from State Open School recognized by State

Government and National Institute of Open School (NIOS) recognized by Central Government having Science subjects and English only.

- ✎ English is a compulsory subject in 10+2 for being eligible for admission to B.Sc. (Nursing).
- ✎ Color blind candidates are eligible provided that Color corrective contact lens and spectacles are worn by such candidates.
- ✎ Candidate shall be medically fit.
- ✎ Married candidates are also eligible for admission.
- ✎ Students shall be admitted once in a year.
- ✎ Selection of candidates should be based on the merit of the entrance examination. Entrance test shall comprise of:

a) Aptitude for Nursing	20 marks
b) Physics	20 marks
c) Chemistry	20 marks
d) Biology	20 marks
e) English	20 marks

- Reservation Policy - Reservation of seats in for admission in Nursing Colleges for SC/ST/OBC/EWSs/PH
- Admission under the reserved quota shall be subject to reservation policy and eligibility criteria for SC/ST/OBC/EWSs prescribed by the Central Govt./State Govt./Union Territory as applicable to the College concerned.
- In respect of candidates belonging to SC/ST/OBC the marks obtained in 3 core subjects shall be 40% instead of 45% for General category candidates.
- Reservation for disability - 5% Disability reservation to be considered for disabled candidates with a disability of loco-motor to the tune of

40% to 50% of the lower extremity and other eligibility criteria with regard to qualification will be same as prescribed for General category candidates. The upper age limit shall be relaxed by 5 years for disabled candidates.

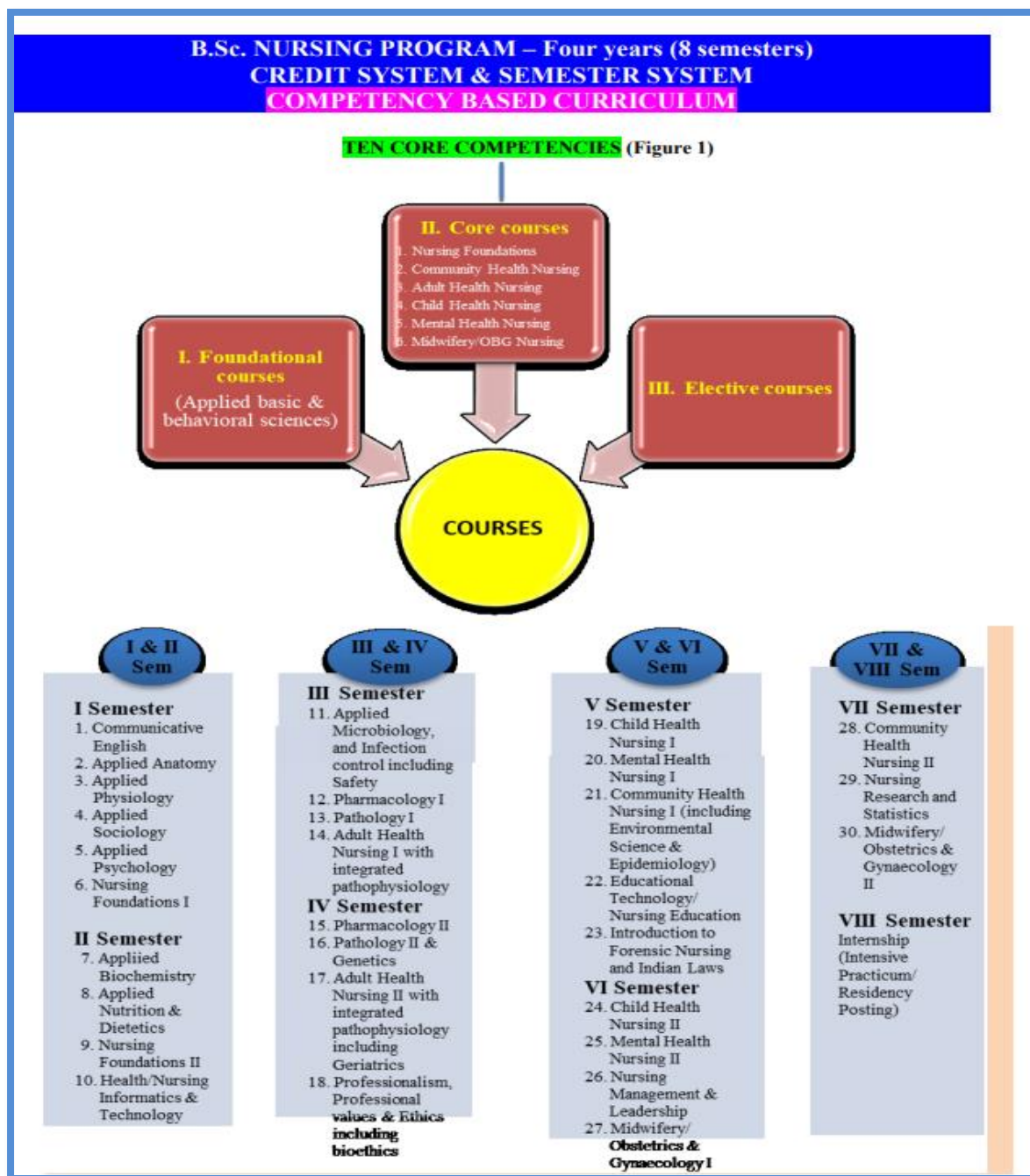
- **Note:** A committee to be formed consisting of medical officer authorized by medical board of State government and a nursing expert in the panel which may decide whether the candidates have the disability of locomotor to the tune of 40% to 50
- Note:
 - ✎ Reservations shall be applicable within the sanctioned number of the seats.
 - ✎ The start of the semester shall be 1st August every year.
 - ✎ No admission after the cut-off date i.e. 30th September will be undertaken. Further Hall Tickets/Admit Card shall not be issued to the candidates who are admitted after 30th September.
 - ✎ The responsibility of obtaining and verifying the requisite documents for admission lies with the Institution and University.

ADMISSION & EXAMINATION TERMS & CONDITIONS FOR MSC NURSING PROGRAM

Eligibility Criteria/Admission Requirements:

1. The candidate should be a Registered Nurse and Registered midwife or equivalent with any State Nursing Registration Council.
2. The minimum education requirements shall be the passing of: B.Sc. Nursing / B.Sc. Hons. Nursing / Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing with minimum of 55% aggregate marks.

3. The candidate should have undergone in B.Sc. Nursing / B.Sc. Hons. Nursing / Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing in an institution which is recognized by Indian Nursing Council.
4. Minimum one year of work experience after Basic B.Sc. Nursing.
5. Minimum one year of work experience prior or after Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing.
6. Candidate shall be medically fit.
7. 5% relaxation of marks for SC/ST candidates may be given.
8. Entrance/Selection test Selection of the candidates should be based on the merit of the entrance examination held by University or competent authority.

Regulations for examination:

Eligibility for appearing for the examination: 75% of the attendance for theory and practical's. However 100% of attendance for practical before the award of degree Classification of results:

50% pass in each of the theory and practical separately.

- 50-59% Second division
- 60-74% first division

- 75% and above is distinction
- For declaring the rank aggregate of 2 years marks to be considered If the candidate fails in either practical's or theory paper he/she has to reappear for both the papers (theory and practical)

Maximum no. of attempts per subject is three (3) inclusive of first attempt.

The maximum period to complete the course successfully should not exceed 4 years Candidate who fails in any subject, shall be permitted to continue the studies into the second year.

However the candidate shall not be allowed to appear for the Second year examination till such time that he/she passes all subjects of the first year M.Sc nursing examination

Practicals

- 4 hours of practical examination per student.
- Maximum number of 10 students per day per specialty.
- The examination should be held in clinical area only for clinical specialties
- One internal and external should jointly conduct practical examination
- Examiner – Nursing faculty teaching respective specialty area in M.Sc nursing programme with minimum 3 years' experience after M.Sc nursing.

Dissertation Evaluation of the dissertation should be done by the examiner prior to viva Duration: Viva-voce -minimum 30 minutes per student

ANTI RAGGING POLICY AT CON, GIMS

College of nursing, GIMS has an extremely vigilant committee on anti-ragging to prohibit, prevent and eliminate the scourge of ragging of any type within the college campus. The Committee includes faculty members and student volunteers from different departments. The committee meets often and when needed to discuss the anti- ragging directives received from UGC and put them into action. The committee also actively discusses its functioning and activities to be undertaken throughout the academic session. The anti-ragging committee is reconstituted every year like any other staff association committee as per the college directive. It ensures the implementation of the preventive measure and undertakes frequent and surprise checks/ visits to ensure ragging free campus. Broadly put ragging is any act resulting in mental/physical and sexual abuse, verbal abuse, and indecent behavior, criminal intimidation/wrong restraint, under mining human dignity, financial exploitation and use of force. As per the guidelines of UGC and University of Delhi,ragging constitutes one or more of any intention by any student or group of students on:

- ✓ Display of noisy, disorderly conduct, teasing, excitement by rough or rude treatment.
- ✓ Handling, including rowdy, undisciplined activities which cause or

likely to cause annoyance.

- ✓ Undue hardships, physical or psychological harm or raise apprehensive fear in a fresher.
- ✓ Asking the students to do any act or perform something which any student would not do in the ordinary course and which causes him/her shame or embarrassment or danger to his/her life, etc.

Punishment for Participation in/or Abetment of Ragging:

- ✎ Cancellation of admission.
- ✎ Suspension from attending classes
- ✎ Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits.
- ✎ Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.
- ✎ Debarring from representing the institution in any national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
- ✎ Suspension/expulsion from the hostel.
- ✎ Rustication from the institution for periods varying from 1 to 3 semesters or equivalent period.
- ✎ Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission

to any other institution.

✎ Implication of fine

Objectives of Anti Ragging Committee: The Anti-Ragging Committee will be the supervisory and advisory committee in preserving a culture of Ragging Free Environment in the college Campus.

The student volunteers will work under the supervision of Anti Ragging committee and to engage in the works of checking Places like Canteens, Classrooms and other places of student congregation. The Anti-Ragging committee will be involved in designing strategies and action plans for curbing the menace of ragging in the college by adopting an array of activities.

Responsibilities of Anti Ragging Committee:

- ✦ To keep a vigil and stop the incidences of Ragging, if any, happening / reported in the places of student aggregation including, classrooms, canteen, grounds, lawns etc.
- ✦ Mandated Orientation Programme for fresher's and parents to familiarize them with the institutional rules and regulations inclusive of anti-ragging measures, what constitutes ragging and the consequences to be faced.
- ✦ Prepare fresher's not to oblige to such practices if at all they face any but

to report boldly.

- ✦ As a preventive measure a member of the committee is appointed during the admission procedure throughout.
- ✦ Regular policing by the committee members and student's volunteers members in the beginning of the odd semester every year.
- ✦ To educate the students by adopting various means about the menace of ragging and related punishments there too.
- ✦ Assurance to maintain their confidentiality if reported.
- ✦ Make discrete random surveys.

Future Plans:

- ✦ Arrange for professional counseling sessions to prevent any untoward incidents to both seniors and fresher.
- ✦ Appoint mentoring cells involving senior students of college.
